

On 8 November, 2013, Typhoon Haiyan *s*wept through the Philippines with wind speeds of **over 300 km/h**. The tropical storm has brought **devastating destruction** to the region: more than **6,000 people have died** and **2,000 are** still **missing**. About 12 million people have been directly affected by the disaster, and four million people were forced to flee.

There is **destruction as far as the eye can see** as hardly any building could

withstand the force of the typhoon. An employee of the organisation "Jugend eine Welt" was able to **assess the situation** on site. Several islands in the disaster region have been visited in order to develop projects together with the affected and the Salesian Sisters of Don Bosco.







Minglanilla is located in the southern part of Cebu City, where many **typhoon victims, in search of a new home**, have settled in provisional shelters with the **hope of finding work** in the metropolis. However, to many this request continues to be denied. Minor girls are in danger of becoming victims of human trafficking under false promises made primarily by criminal gangs, but also relatives and neighbours.
